Dr Dost highlighted the main items in the report. These included a 20% increase in accident stats over the last reporting period. There was a discussion about the possible reasons. 5b	<p><b>RMA</b> RMA had provided a written progress report. Attached as annex 3 to these minutes. RMA are collecting accident statistics. These show a downward trend. RMA have provided members with H&amp;S information packs and a model company H&amp;S action plan for them to adopt/adapt to their needs and are encouraging member companies to implement H&amp;S action plans.</p>			
5c	<p><b>ITMA</b> No report. Dr Dost reported that as ITMA's activities are office based their accidents stats are likely to be benign.</p>

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5f	<p><b>Trade Unions</b></p> <p>Mr Hudspith said that the TU representatives recognize that it takes time for stakeholders to adopt and implement action plans to carry forward the Rubbing Out the Risks strategy but that RUBIAC needs to see the results of action plans so that it can decide what it needs to do to ensure that the strategy keeps on track. He noted that BRPPA and BTMA had provided the information needed for their sectors but that this was not the case for some of the other stakeholder groups. He also reported on the TU input to the joint HSE/IOD guidance for Directors on H&amp;S leadership, into the work of ACTs and on the issue of corporate manslaughter.</p>			
5g	<p><b>HSE</b></p> <p><i>Research into methods of securing loads on curtain-sided Lorries.</i> Mr King reported that the final phase of the research had been completed; the draft report from the research contractors was expected within a week or so and would be discussed at a meeting of the project team planned for end of April. The researcher's will then finalise the report which, following approval by HSE management, will be published on the HSE website. It was agreed that RUBIAC will need to decide what action to take in response to the report's findings in relation to securing of loads of rubber and ancillary products.</p> <p><i>Fatal accident.</i> Ms Rank outlined what was known about the circumstances of a fatal accident at a rubber coating manufacturer during a process involving inspecting the product for defects.</p> <p>There followed discussion about the issue of alerting employers in the industry about the lessons from circumstances of fatal and serious accidents. Chair outlined the rules and procedures that, in most cases, prevent HSE for releasing information arising from an ongoing investigation as doing so would prejudice the investigation itself and/or any subsequent trial. 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	evidence that could prejudice the enquiry or legal process. Final decisions on this were made by the investigating officers on the basis of legal advice. The main difficulty was that each case had to be looked at on its merits with the balance point between public interest for release and public interest in maintaining the effectiveness of the regulatory system. He could not comment on any procedures that might be followed by other stakeholders.			
6	<p><b>Update on HSE Disease Reduction Program</b></p> <p>Mr McAlinden gave a detailed presentation providing an update of the progress with HSE's disease reduction programme in so far as it relates to the rubber industries and outlined HSE's LEV (Local Exhaust Ventilation) project. Members were provided with copies of the presentation with the papers. Chair thanked Mr McAlinden for the presentation.</p>			
7	<p><b>Research into Industry Targeted Initiatives</b></p> <p>Chair gave a presentation summarizing the findings of research commissioned by HSE into the effectiveness of industry targeted initiatives. These included previous RUBIAC three year action plans. The research showed that these initiatives can be effective.</p>			
8	<p><b>AOB</b></p> <p>Dr Dost reported that IARC are to reassess carcinogens and their use in industries including rubber industry. EDRMA will be making submissions to IARC including pointing out that benzene and Beta Naphthylamine are no longer used in the industry.</p> <p>Dr Dost reported HSE had done work in relation to MbOCA following its reclassification from category 2a to category 1 and that a BRPPA study is also on going. He proposed that RUBIAC becomes the final body to whom HSE and BRPPA should submit the results of their studies for review. This was agreed. Dr Dost also requested members views on whether RUBIAC should produce and publish a statement in relation to the evidence of any cancer risks associated with handling and use of MbOCA in the same way it had for rubber dust and fume.
