

WAH(A)R 2007

Enforcement Expectations

No particular pro-active enforcement in the adventure activities sector is required or expected.

The existing good practices and ways of working in the sector are considered to be compliant with WAH(A)R 2007.

WAH(A)R 2007

- AALA (AALS) inspectors will advise of matters of significant concern
- Normal standards of discretion apply
- Normal rules for enforcement apply

WAHR 2005

- The existing good practices of the sector are also considered to be compliant with WAHR 2005
- Sector is exemplary in planning and organisation
- Competency standards are good
- Well developed training
- Advanced culture of managing risk

WAHR 2005

- The equipment used is considered to be compliant with WAHR 2005
- The way it is used is considered to be compliant with WAHR 2005
- Helmets protect against falling objects
- Notices on mountains are NOT required
- Existing good systems for examination and maintenance of equipment are compliant with WAHR and PUWER/LOLER

WAHR 2005

- Not reasonably practicable to formally inspect workplaces in wild country – but reasonable to expect formal inspection of a ropes course.
- If in doubt about enforcement ask first!
