



## **ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON DANGEROUS PATHOGENS**

### **Review of published ACDP guidance**

#### **Issue**

1. ACDP have produced a considerable amount of occupationally related guidance on controlling microbiological risks in the workplace environment. Members are provided with a list of current publications and asked to consider which, if any, should be considered for review and consequently placed on ACDP's future work plans.

#### **Background**

2. ACDP's occupationally related guidance covers many topic areas and encompasses a large number of industry sectors. Current guidance which remains extant ranges from dates as far back as 1994 to the present. With the passage of time, scientific and technological advancements, some of the guidance documents may now be outdated. Furthermore with the advent of the new single regulatory framework and "Contained Use" 2010 regulations, all of the existing guidance material will reference legislation that has been amended or revoked. Members are provided with a chronological list of current documents, all of which are still available either in hardcopy format or as web based files for download.
3. It will be important for future ACDP work plans for members to identify which of the current guidance listed is:
  - still required
  - in need of replacement or amendment

Furthermore, Members should consider guidance replacement or amendment in order of priority to facilitate future ACDP programmes of work

- Identify publications that are no longer needed;
  - Identify and prioritise guidance for replacement or amendment; and
  - Identify new guidance which may be required.
