Disease Reduction Programme	DRP1	Asbestos	Asbestos is still a very serious hazard and maintenance workers are one of the most vulnerable groups. The project will prevent further exposure to maintenance workers if we are to avoid similar numbers of deaths in the future
Disease Reduction Programme	DRP2	Cancer	It is estimated that there are ~6000 occupational cancer deaths annually and consequently there is a rising political expectation that HSE will take action
Disease Reduction Programme	DRP3	Respiratory Disease	This project focuses on reducing a range of respiratory diseases in a broad range of industries by looking at controlling dust and fume by a range of measures, e.g. substitution, control at source, engineering control
Disease Reduction Programme	DRP4	Skin Disease	This project looks to reduce incidences of skin disease amongst workers. It offers most potential to hit PSA targets and an opportunity to develop partnership working with LAs
Injury Reduction Programme	IR1	Falls From Height - continuation of HSE Head Office Inspector Visits	Continuation from 2006/07 of HSE head office inspector visits with companies who manage and procure building and plant maintenance activities and those who do the work
Injury Reduction Programme	IR2	Falls From Height - Ladders Week	'Ladders Week' June 2007 to include 3 events per division in conjunction with partners from the Height Aware Campaign. There will be a month long 'ladders amnesty' in partnership with BLMA and volunteer local authorities
