# OH MODEL - AIMS

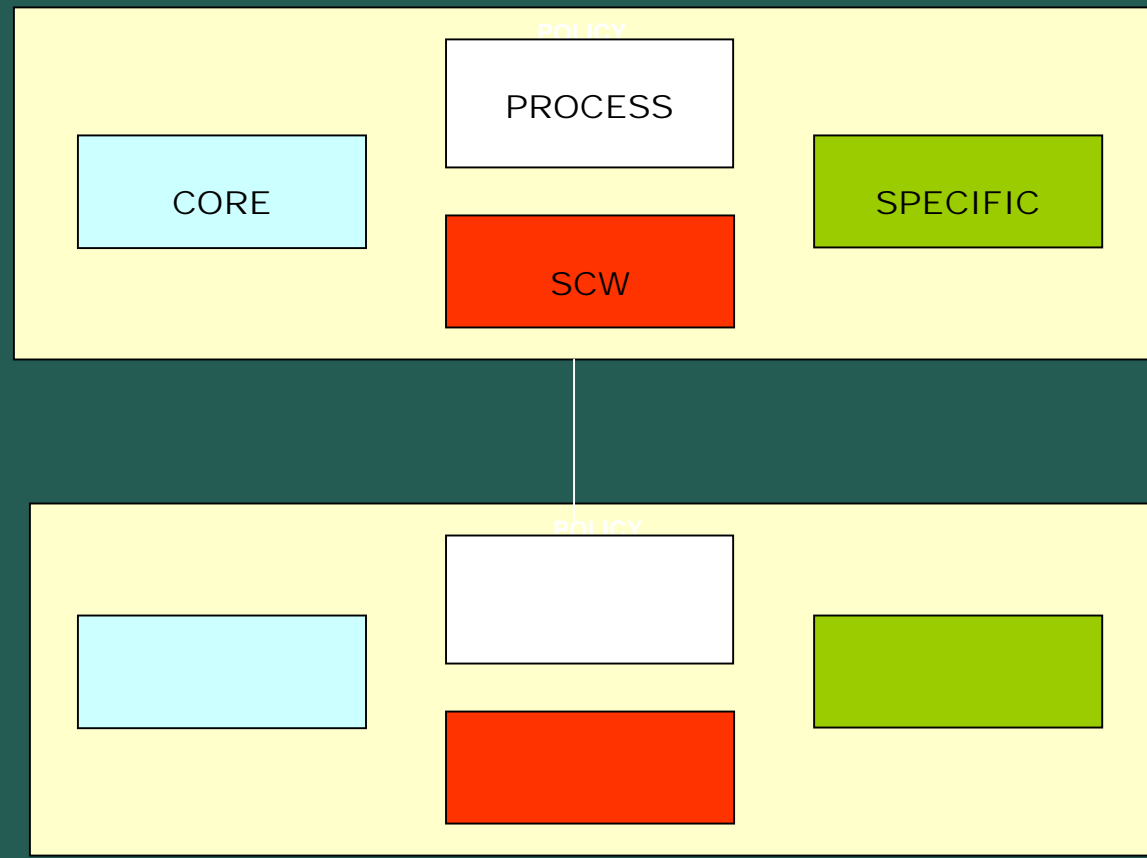
1. Provide a clear steer to stakeholders

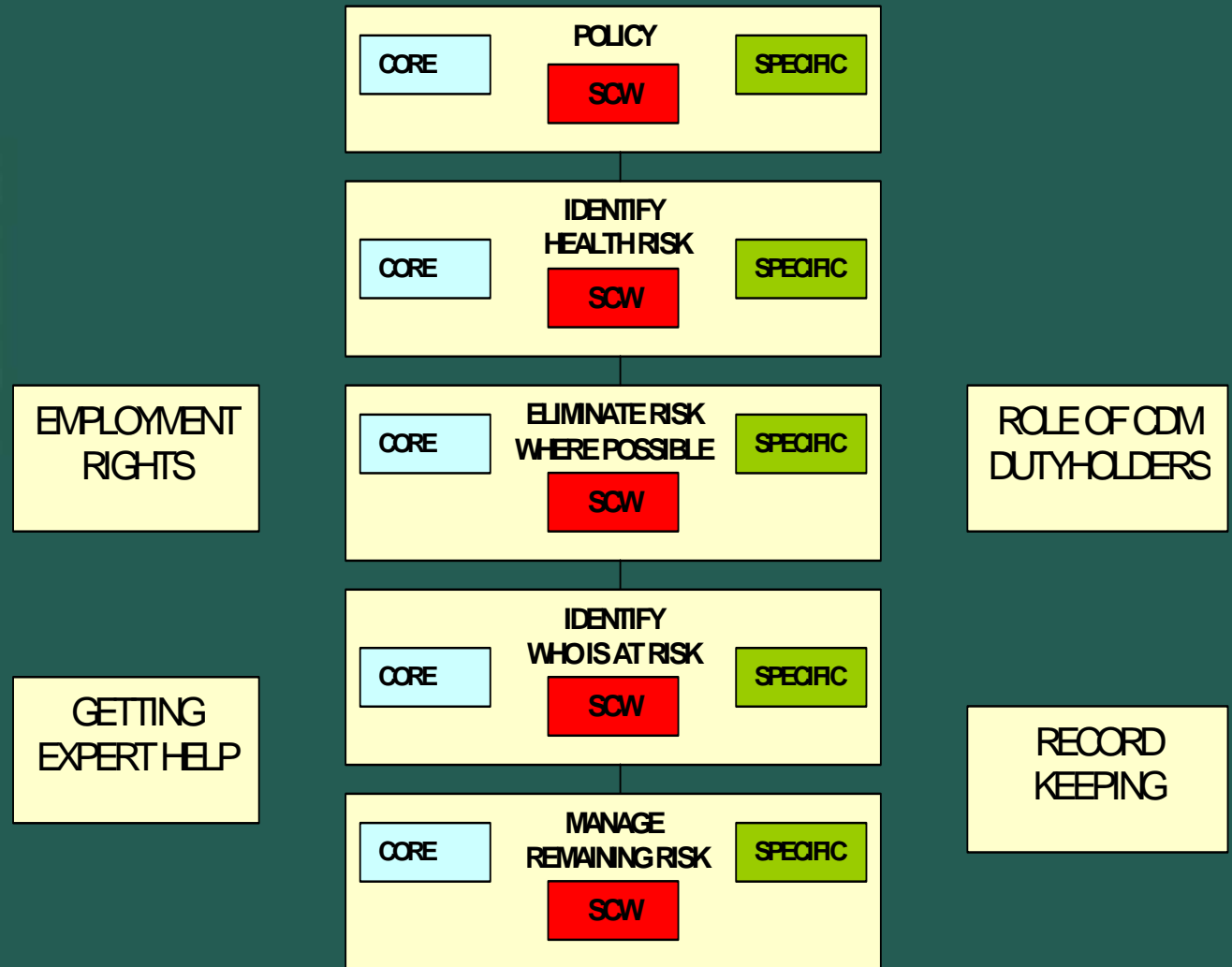




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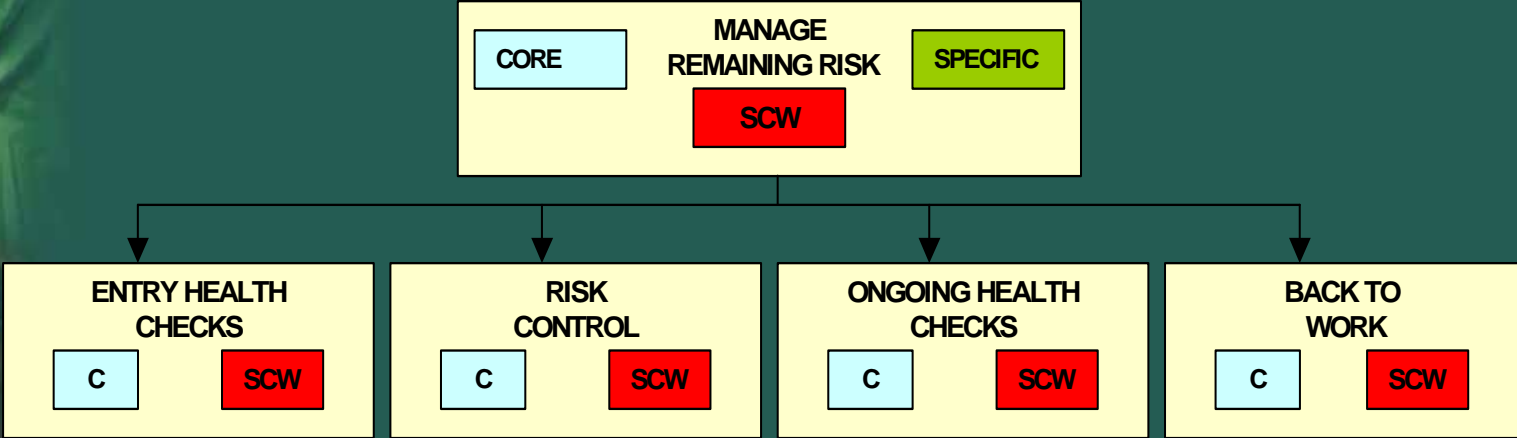
