

Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974**Control of Explosives Regulations 1991****Certificate of Exemption No 2 of 2010**

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by paragraph (1) of regulation 17 of the Control of Explosives Regulations 1991 ("the 1991 Regulations") and being satisfied as required by paragraph (2) of that regulation, the Health and Safety Executive exempts marine distress signals from the requirements and prohibitions imposed by regulations 7, 8, 9, 12 and 13 of the 1991 Regulations.
2. In this certificate:-

“marine distress signals” means pyrotechnic articles designed to attract attention in the event of a maritime emergency and allocated in accordance with the United Nations Recommendations the UN no. 0505, 0506 or 0507; and

“UN no.” and “United Nations Recommendations” have the same meanings as they are given in the 1991 Regulations.
3. This certificate shall continue in force until its revocation by the Health and Safety Executive by a certificate in writing.
