

Fit Out Campaign

October 2005

The Health and Safety Executive will be conducting a national inspection campaign targeted towards the management of Working at Height (WaH) and Good Order during Fit Out in October 2005. What will HSE's Con struction Inspectors be lookin g for during the campaign?

Working at Height

- Principal Contractors have arrangements to ensure that the work on their sites is effectively managed.
- Contractor competence is checked and their work is monitored.
- Contractors have undertaken a risk assessment for work at height to select the right equipment following the WaH hierarchy* and ensure the equipment is being used properly.
- Users of equipment are competent, equipment has been correctly installed/assembled, inspected and maintained as appropriate.

There is a range of solutions that can be adapted to most situations. If working from ladders or steps is chosen, it needs to be justified.

*WaH hierarchy of control measures:

- 1. Avoid working at height if possible
- 2. Use an existing safe place of work
- 3. Provide work equipment to prevent falls
- 4. Mitigate distance and consequences of a fall
- 5. Give instruction and training and/or other means.

For the above, collec tive protective measures (such as scaffolding) must be prioriti sed over personal protection (such as using a fall arrest harness).

Good Order

- Ground conditions are kept reasonable so that both traffic and pedestrian routes are firm and even.
- Traffic routes are segregated from pedestrian routes and kept clear of obstructions.
- Delivery, unloading, handling and removal of equipment/materials/waste are planned with adequate storage areas.
- Good housekeeping to include clear pedestrian routes and stairways that are free from trailing cables, debris, and other trip hazards.
- Workplaces are clear of unnecessary obstructions and waste material is cleared up promptly.
- Holes and excavations are adequately protected.
